

ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION EXAM

WHAT IS IT? The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is an exam required for those planning on joining

any branch of the military but the program isn't just for students interested in the military. The ASVAB Career Exploration Program helps students to discover their strengths and interests and then map out post-

secondary plans with comprehensive information for over 1,000 occupations.

WHO IS IT FOR? The test is open to any Simley student in grades 10-12 who want to learn more about their career options or

for those that are interested in joining the military.

WHEN IS IT? There are 2 parts to the ASVAB Career Exploration Program.

Part 1: Aptitude Test on Tuesday, October 5, 2021 @ 8:30 AM

Part 2: Score interpretation, interest self-assessment, and career exploration tools in late October (TBD)

WHAT'S THE COST? The ASVAB is offered to Simley students at no cost.
